

All events will be squadded and competitors must present themselves at the appropriate range
10 minutes before the time indicated and after their weapons have been passed by Weapons Control.

No one will be permitted to shoot if not in possession of a stamped squadding card and authorised weapon. All details will start on time and no late comers will be admitted to the ranges. Re-entries will only be possible if range space is available and Application must be made in person to the Control Office in the Dukka Hut.

The last date for receipt of UK entries is March 20th 1976. No entries may be made at the range other than re-entries if space is available. Overseas entries enclosing an International Money Order to be received not later than March 1st 1976. All overseas entries must specify the names of competitors, weapon numbers and quantities of ammunition, in order that a UK Fire Arms Certificate can be acquired. Applications for Team entries must specify names of team members. MEDALS

Only one Standard Medal can be won per competitor but if three or more standard scores are made the competitor will receive a superior medal. A MASTER SHOT medal will be awarded for achieving the Gold Standard Scores listed in one or more events.

Note: Marylebone will not provide any refreshment facilities.
